thing to get as many guns off the streets of Philadelphia as possible? Hard to do, many say, but not impossible. One of the ways we've witnessed in our city that guns can get off the streets is through Gun Give-Back programs like one recently held in South Philadelphia over the summer of 2018. That particular gun-

give-back program was co-sponsored by a number of elected officials including PA State Senator Anthony H. Williams, PA State Representative Joanna Mc Clinton, and City Councilman Kenyatta Johnson. Senator Williams stated, "It was the most successful gun buyback in the city and the region so we are tremendously excited about that, but even more important are the types of guns removed from the

important are the types of guns removed from the streets: assault weapons, assault pistols, automatics, things that are current, not just grandpa's gun underneath the bed were here today," Williams said.

State Representative Joanna McClinton stated, "It's not a new invention, but it's a program that we brought back so that we could help save a life," she said. "Most people who came today seemed to be law abiding, many of them grandparent, turning in guns that unfortunately, we have grandparents, turning in guns that, unfortunately, we have seen kill young children in the home accidentally. We've seen them stolen from homes either in a burglary or by an-other family member and as a result the gun violence in this city is totally out of control." At the end of that event, some 300 guns had been turned in which is a very good

This Saturday, August 18, Philadelphia Sheriff Jewell Williams will host a special Gun Give-Back event in North Philadelphia. The event will take place from 10 am to 1 pm at Official Unlimited, 2331 North Broad Street. The gun back is part the Sheriff's third annual Philadelphia Summers of Peace, a signature anti-gun and anti-violence

Sherriff Williams commented, "Just this summer, in the month of July in one week, we lost a 14-year old boy and three other children and a man was injured as a result of gun violence." "In 2016, a report issued by the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia noted that '4,648 young people ages 10-24 were victims of homicide an average of 13 each day.' This is completely unacceptable. I am determined to della fear the behavior that the part that there is the state there. mined to do all I can to help get guns off the streets there-fore I am encouraging Philadelphian's to turn in forgotten or unwanted handguns and assault weapons with no ques-

For every gun that is received this Saturday, the Sheriff's Office will provide a \$75.00 gift card from Official Unlim-

ited. The gift cards will be good towards the purchase of apparel from premiere names brands such as Nike, Puma, Uggs. Free gun locks will also be given away at the event. Guns must be delivered unloaded but must be in working condition to qualify.

I recognize we can all only do what we can do. Nonetheless I am asking that corporate level businesses and others that won't be crushed by giving away free gift cards, to

cials who are willing to then in turn, give-away the gift cards at events they host, where residents are encouraged to turn in working guns that they no longer want, or that they found, or that were given to them. Turn in a gun and

PA State Senator Vincent Hughes, City Councilman Curtis Jones, Jr., City Councilwoman Blondell Reynolds Brown and other elected officials in Philadelphia have teamed up to host similar kinds of Gun Give-Back events. I encourage them to continue to do so. However, we need big corporations to step up to the plate and help our elected officials, with a donation such as free gift cards that can be provided to residents who turn in guns.
