

Need help with home repairs?

The Basic Systems Home Repair (BSRP) provides free repairs to correct electrical, plumbing, heating, limited structural and carpentry, and roofing emergencies in eligible owner-occupied homes in Philadelphia.

To be eligible for free emergency repairs you must:

- Own and live in the single-family house with the problem
- Be current or under current payment agreement for property taxes & water bill
- Meet the income guidelines
- Not own any other residential property
