On March 15th, ACHa welcomed over 100 families to shop great goods, like diapers from Cradles to Crayons, pantry items from Keep it Real Ministry, and clothing from URBN. The Philadelphia School District assisted parents in registering for early childhood education programs while West Philadelphia Reading Captains shared Women's History Month literature and learning resources. Neighbors attended weatherization workshops to reduce home energy bills, accessed utility grants, and received foreclosure prevention resources.


### **Safe Streets Events**

## Need help with home repairs?

The Basic Systems Repair Program (BSRP) provides free home repairs to correct electrical, heating, plumbing, limited structural and carpentry, and roofing emergencies in eligible owner-occupied Philadelphia residence.

#### To be eligible for free emergency repairs you must:

- Own and live in the single-family house with the problem
- Be current or under current payment agreement for property taxes & water bill
- Meet the income guidelines
- Not own any other residential property
